Who can volunteer?

Squadron Sponsoring Committee

Volunteer

Director or Member

These volunteer positions are a must-have at a squadron. The Squadron Sponsoring Committee (SSC) operates the business function of the Squadron.

Possible Positions:

- Squadron Sponsor Chair
- Treasurer
- Vice-chair
- Secretary
- Member

These positions require regular meetings although they may not be required on a weekly basis.

The committee has the responsibility to provide a training location for cadets, paying the bills, fundraising, and providing necessary paperwork and recruiting for the program.



Volunteers work at the local squadron level and support the squadrons in various ways. Often the volunteers are parents of current and former cadets.

- Canteen Organizer
- Fundraising
- Volunteer Drivers
- Event Support
- Tag Days Volunteers
- Effective Speaking



Directors and members must be nominated and approved as volunteers to help support their provincial committees.

There are several ways a director can support the organization.

League Representatives are members who are the liaison between the squadron sponsoring committee and provincial committee. These members are resources for the SSC. They have the ability to teach volunteers.



Members-at-Large are able to support the Air Cadet League in various capacities. While they are not responsible for a particular squadron, they may be responsible for contributing to other aspects of the program.
