LANGLEY CADET HONOURED WITH MEDAL OF BRAVERY 12TH CADET IN HISTORY TO RECEIVE MEDAL

Do you think you could make a lifesaving decision for your family at 12 years old?

It is a hard idea to wrap your head around, but Leading Air Cadet (LAC) Jai Vansh Behl had to make that exact choice.

October 16th in 2022 started off as a normal day. LAC Behl joined his mother and grandmother on a trip to Walmart in Langley, BC. As they were driving home, LAC Behl's mother began having a seizure causing her to press her foot down on the accelerator. Without a second thought, LAC Behl jumped into action by unbuckling his seatbelt, lunging into the front seat, and grabbing the wheel to avoid imminent danger. Unfortunately, the vehicle swerved across four lanes and ended up crashing into a utility pole, which left LAC Behl and his mother in a coma. Everyone in the vehicle would survive, but LAC Behl would lose 85% of his vision and his mother would be bound to a wheelchair. Nonetheless, LAC Behl's heroic efforts prevented what could have been a far graver outcome in this story.

On Thursday, February 29th, 2024, 746 Lightning Hawk Royal Canadian Air Cadet Squadron (RCACS) gathered on parade to watch LAC Behl receive the Cadet Award of Bravery Medal.

The Cadet Award of Bravery may be awarded to a cadet who performs an outstanding deed of valour involving risk of life in attempting to save the life or property of others. Approval of recipients is conducted by a national board in Ottawa, ON which is comprised of several high-ranking members within the Canadian Cadet Organization (CCO). The board reviews applications bi-annually and goes through a very thorough examination before making a final decision. Since the award's conception, there have only been 11 previous winners across Canada, and LAC Behl marks the 12th. He is the first person to receive this award in BC since 2016



"My mother tongue is Punjabi, I speak English fluently, and yet I still cannot find the words. I'm speechless" LAC Behl said after receiving the medal in front of an audience of 200+ people. Despite this distinguished heroism, LAC Behl does not consider himself a hero.

"I appreciate getting this award and the recognition, but at the end of the day, I love my mother. I did it for her, and I would do it again if I had to," said LAC Behl.

Others who are aware of his brave act say that what he did was nothing short of heroism.

On parade, Regional Cadet Support Unit (RCSU) Pacific's Chief Warrant Officer, Chief Warrant Officer David Schultz, read the police report by Adrian Marsden, Superintendent Officer in Charge Langley Detachment, which stated:

".... The presence of mind and willingness to act displayed by young Jai cannot be overstated. He showed remarkable courage in the face of a very dangerous situation and did not hesitate where many would have frozen in fear. This is even more impressive considering he is a 12-year-old with no experience operating a motor vehicle. The bravery displayed by Jai Behl during this traumatic event is commendable."

Civilian Volunteer (CV) Kim Becker is an adult staff member at 746 RCACS. Not only running the First Aid Team at the unit, but also a paramedic as her full-time job, she knows how hard it is to make logical decisions in situations such as in LAC Behl's.



"It's incredible," CV Becker started off when asked about his actions. "It takes a lot of strength and courage to not only recognize your mother is going through something scary and is driving a car, which is now swerving off the road. Not only recognizing that, and then taking the initiative to, quite literally, jump out of your seat and grab the wheel to protect the ones you love. Yes, it is quite well deserved."

After the incident, LAC Behl took time off from cadets to recover. When he returned in April of 2023, his peers and adult staff welcomed him back with open arms.

Cadet Flight Sergeant (FSgt) Aiden Kim, a Senior Cadet at 746 RCACS, spoke highly of LAC Behl and captured the collective feeling of the squadron.

"I've come to find that he's [LAC Behl] one of the most respectful cadets that I have ever met." FSgt Kim said. "He's always acknowledging me and trying to have a nice conversation. He's just a very positive person overall."

FSgt Kim is also on the First Aid team, and talked about how LAC Behl's actions emphasized why learning First Aid is so important.

"It's really important to us because you never know what could go wrong, so I think it's important for us to be equipped...having that little bit of knowledge can be really important not just for yourself, but also for the people around you"

With LAC Behl's brave act etched into history, he is excited to continue his road to recovery and his career in cadets. Ending his interview, he wanted to share a final thought.

"When things in your life that are hard happen like this, you have two choices: you can be optimistic, be positive, and fight through like a fighter, or you can be pessimistic and just stay negative and cry about it all day long and not do anything. I'm walking, I'm talking and I'm here doing this interview. So please, to the people out there that are listening that could be going through a rough time in their life, I'm telling you, stay positive. You're a fighter."

A SHINING EXAMPLE OF THE CADET PROGRAM'S SUCCESS

April marks a significant milestone in Canadian aviation history as the Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) celebrates its 100th anniversary. From its humble beginnings in 1924, the RCAF has grown to become a vital component of Canada's defense and a symbol of excellence in aerial operations.

Speaking about his experience, Shaw expressed his gratitude towards the Air Cadet program, stating, "The opportunity to earn my power pilot's

license through the Air Cadet program has been life changing. It has not only fueled my passion for aviation but has also opened doors to exciting career prospects in the field. I highly recommend anyone who is interested in aviation to look into Air Cadets."

In celebrating 100 years of Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) excellence, let us also look towards the future and continue to inspire and support the next generation of Canadian aviators.

It's with great sadness that we announce the passing of Senator Joseph Day on May 27. He was a devoted husband, father, grandfather, and friend. He was known for his unconditional love for his family, his kind words for everyone, and his unwavering loyalty.

Joe grew up in Hampton, NB, where he learned the value of hard work and helping others at his family's grocery store. He chose the Royal Military College in Kingston, Ontario, where he graduated with high honors in Engineering, an experience that would create life long friends. He then pursued law at Queens University and a Master's degree at Osgoode Hall Law School. He remained deeply involved with the Royal Military College and many local, provincial and national boards throughout his life.

He was an ardent supporter of Royal Canadian Air Cadets.

It is with great sadness that we hear of the passing of a MGen (ret'd) Ken Lett, May 15, at the age of 100.

Ken Lett started a lifelong affair with aviation as a teenage pilot in World War Two (see here receiving his wings from Prime Minister Mackenzie King in 1942). He was a member of RCAF 402(F) Squadron flying the famous Spitfire aircraft and, while stationed in England, participated in many raids on the continent to disrupt Nazi Germany's logistical efforts to support their war effort. In his own words, he attacked anything that moved with a swastika - including trains and truck convoys.

His highlight of the war was his participation in the D-Day landings at Normandy by flying many sorties of "top cover" for the Allied troops coming ashore in France; an invaluable contribution to the success of the D-Day landings. He continued in this role for several weeks until the beachheads, and surrounding areas in France, were secured.

Ken joined the post-war Royal Canadian Air Force/Canadian Forces and served in many capacities from squadron pilot to senior command and staff positions. A highlight was his membership on the selection team that chose the CF-104 as the replacement for the Canadair F-86 Sabre in the early 1960's. As such, he was a natural choice to be the first Commanding Officer of #6 Strike/Recce Operational Training Unit at RCAF Station Cold Lake, Alberta, the unit responsible for training military pilots on the new CF-104. Rising to the rank of Major-General, Ken retired from the RCAF as Deputy Chief of Staff Operations in NORAD, after enjoying an outstanding military career.

After his retirement from the RCAF, Ken moved to Calgary and stayed in the aviation world. He was President and CEO of a family of companies including the Executive Flight Centre, a commercial air charter service operating from Calgary and Edmonton, a flying school at Springbank and three leasing companies. In addition to his executive duties, Ken flew on worldwide operations as a Learjet Captain and was, therefore, an active pilot from 1941 to 1989 - which is a remarkable achievement.

Ken was the Chairman and majority owner of Executive Flight Centre Fuel Services Ltd, a company which provides facilities and services to the aviation industry with a fleet of over forty refueling trucks. His involvement in community activities includes serving as a Director and President of the Alberta Aviation Council, the Calgary Airport Business Association, Director of the Air Transport Association, the Aerospace Museum Association of Calgary, The Calgary Airport Authority and a member of the Calgary Transportation Authority. Perhaps his greatest contribution to the aviation community was as a founding member of the Air Force Museum Society of Alberta where he was a major financial contributor to the original Air Force Museum in Calgary. He followed this up with a



major contribution of several hundred thousand dollars to establish infrastructure for the Ken and Roma Lett Cold War Exhibit (adjoining the main museum in Calgary) which houses the aircraft (F-86 Sabre, the CF-104 and CF-18) that the RCAF flew in Europe as part of NATO during the Cold War from 1951 to 1989. Indeed, Ken provided another several hundred thousand dollars to purchase the F-86 and the CF-104 - which are mainstays of the Cold War Exhibit. He recently donated \$2.4 million dollar to the Mount Royal University Aviation Diploma program!

In summer 2021, The Air Cadet League of Canada (ACL) was proud to announce an historical donation of \$1.02 Million from Major-General (Ret'd) Ken C. Lett. This donation represents the largest sum ever donated to the ACL in the history of the League. The gift supported the creation of an academic scholarship fund for Air cadets. Specifically, scholarships, which are named the "K.C. Lett Scholarships" are awarded for postsecondary enrolment in an aviation related program at an accredited educational institution or for continuation flying at a certified flight school.
