

Empowering the Youth



It's June 14th, 2025, eleven cadets from across Canada are ready; Judges and evaluator, Cadet MCEE, Cadet Correspondent and volunteers, mostly from QOV, are ready. The 2025 in-person National Effective Speaking Competition is about to begin. This is how this year's National Air Cadet League Effective Speaking Competition began, and what an incredible event it was. It featured eleven very talented young future leaders making presentations that impacted all who attended the National Competition held in Ottawa.

We had representation from all ten provinces and Pan-Territories in Canada. These cadets were the best of the best. They all had to compete through multiple levels to get here; Local (squadron), Regional/Wing and Provincial competitions. All the Local, Regional/Wing and Provincial competitions were able to hold in-person or virtual events. It is our first in-person National Competition since the pandemic. Jacob Wagner Effective Speaking Testimony

"There are more things, Lucilius, likely to frighten us than there are to crush us; we suffer more often in imagination than in reality." The words of Seneca rang true during every competition I took part in. What if I stutter? What if I forget a part? What if I'm too boring? While all of these happened at some point, they never brought me down. Instead, they told me to keep going—that it's not the end.

I joined Air Cadets in 2023 and haven't looked back since. Whether it's the friends I've made, experiences I've lived, or skills I've learned, the program has given me value no other place can provide. I'm Sergeant Jacob Wagner, and Air Cadets is a part of me that's irreplaceable. It has taught me discipline, respect, responsibility, and confidence—all while having a blast. But I only gained these skills because I took part in the things I feared the most—shooting an air rifle, performing a precise drill routine, or giving a speech. The mistakes made and fears I've overcome shaped who I am today.

In my first year of Cadets, I was too afraid to attend Effective Speaking. The mere thought of a whole room of people having their eyes on me while I presented a speech filled me with panic. The panic told me to stay out of this one, that it's unimportant. But when I decided to join the 2024 competition, weeks after others had already started, I realized I had a love for it like no other Air Cadet activity. Being able to speak my mind, become more confident, and face my greatest fear drew me towards it. My first competition was rough, and while I forgot a large section of my speech, I gained priceless knowledge and experience in doing so. I placed 3rd in the Squadron, but that didn't discourage me. Rather, it lit a spark, telling me to keep going and to improve. I came back the next year and applied the judges' advice to my speech and ended up winning at the Squadron level.

While my new speech was a lot better, I could see it needed a lot of work, in both its presentation and writing. Each time I got to another level of competition, I worked on improving it, sometimes with the local Toastmasters club. It was the progress that brought me into that room this June, to give a speech in front of everyone, and do so better than I ever had before. I was always afraid of the next hurdle, but after passing it, I saw my fear of public speaking was leaving me. The hours spent memorizing then reciting my speech and learning to gesture meaningfully all came together, and the effort to defeat this anxiety paid off. It was gone, and I could thank only Effective Speaking for bringing me to do this.

The quote by Seneca at the beginning was addressed to Lucilius, his student and a political figure in ancient Roman Sicily. Lucilius was already quite resilient at the time of the letter, but Seneca wanted him to learn that fear comes from the mind, not actual events. Had I known this advice going into the competitions, I would have grown significantly faster not only in conquering my fear of public speaking, but also as a person. While Effective Speaking taught me confidence, that wasn't the bigger picture. The goal was to end a common fear for youth across the country, one many adults never overcome. Effective Speaking is the place for that, where everyone is working towards the same objective. I overcame my fear through trial and error. But now that you are given the opportunity, it's your turn to face the fear. When will you overcome it?

This will be a jam-packed trip for many island students, approximately 50 from Summerside, Kensington and Kinkora surrounding areas.

Each student had to research a veteran to complete their project, and Sgt Seth Thibeau of 53 C.E. Monty DFC Squadron of Summerside happened to choose Captain (Retired) Kendra Mellish. As Provincial Chair of the PEI Air Cadets, she too was to Vimy in 2005 as part of the Nijmegen Canadian Military Team. She understands the value of this history lesson.

After the Three Oaks Senior High School (TOSH) open house on 09 April 2025 and chatting with many students, parents, veterans and faculty members, Kendra saw an opportunity to assist the Prince Edward Island cadets and ease the burden on cadets and their families. Our Provincial Executive voted unanimously to donate \$3000 to each cadet to offset the travel expenses.

It was the right thing to support, to preserve our war history and our veterans' stories, and to inspire the next generation of youths to carry the torch forward. There will be a link to the group's daily exploits online.

We hope to partner with other veteran groups across the island to help raise funds for future trips to Vimy.
