PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

A couple of months remain in the 2025–2026 training year for our squadrons, and I sincerely hope you have enjoyed your time serving as a volunteer with the Air Cadet League of Canada.

Ad Hoc Futures Committee

The Ad Hoc Futures Committee has met five times since the Leadership Forum in June 2026. I am pleased to share that meaningful progress is being made to advance the key outcomes identified at the Forum and to follow up with senior leadership.

In the coming weeks, a survey will be distributed to all volunteers to help us better understand perspectives on the future direction of the League. Your participation will be invaluable in shaping the path forward.

Aviation Committee

An important meeting of the Aviation Committee took place at the end of November 2025. Governor Arlo Speer provided an update at the January 2026 Board of Governors meeting. It was agreed that the mission statement must reflect the League's entire aviation program—not solely the glider program—and align with the mission of the Canadian Armed Forces, as well as with mission statements developed by other groups within our League. A sub-committee will review various funding models and present an initial report to the Aviation Committee. While squadrons are permitted to direct unused RDA and LSA funding toward familiarization flying, it appears that many do not. This matter will be explored

further with the Cadets and Junior Canadian Rangers to identify barriers, encourage greater reallocation of funds toward flying activities, and increase squadron engagement in the flight program. The Committee has also identified several potential external funding sources willing to support our aviation program. In collaboration with the League and CJCR, efforts will focus on leveraging private funding opportunities to strengthen and sustain our aviation initiatives.

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

There is renewed momentum regarding the MOU. The full IMAT group reconvened in February 2026, and all members—including the Canadian Armed Forces—are aligned in working toward a finalized document. The goal is to have the presidents of the three Leagues sign the agreement in the coming months.

Governance Committee

The purpose of the Governance Committee is to support the NEC and Board of Governors in fulfilling their governance responsibilities, ensuring the organization operates ethically, transparently, and in alignment with its mission and applicable legal and regulatory requirements. As you know, the Committee's Terms of Reference were approved by the Board of Governors in January 2026. I am pleased to report that strong foundational work is already underway. This committee has been long overdue and will have a very positive and lasting impact across many areas of our organization.

Dedication of Our Volunteers

Finally, thank you for the dedication and commitment demonstrated by our volunteers across the country. Your time, energy, and passion make a profound difference. Your efforts are deeply appreciated, and I know the cadets recognize and value your support throughout the year. Thank you for everything you do in service of our youth and our mission.

Aside from being the first full month of Spring, April 2026 is also notable as it marks the 85th anniversary of the Air Cadet League's founding back in 1941. This is a significant event, one well worth making noise about!

In recognition of the 85th we're seeking stories, quotes, photos, and other memorabilia about the League's 85 years of service to Canada and Canadian youth. We're asking League members across Canada to help us compile those historical assets. Provincial-Territorial Committees are also asked to reach out to local Squadrons for their assistance in this search.

This year, starting in April, we're thinking every month would feature material from a "decade", with each following month relating to a specific decade. The idea is that these features can be showcased at the local level as well as at the provincial-territorial and national ones.

Such features could include:

- *A Former Cadet -- who they are and where they are now. Or it could be a Cadet who now holds a prominent position or is a community leader.
- *"Generational stories" of families who have had a lengthy involvement as Volunteers in the Air Cadet League, accompanied by photos. Such family histories combine with the Cadets' strong sense of the program's importance, passed down from generation to generation.
- * The History of a Squadron -- including photos and a history about the unit. Squadrons that are no longer active, but which had some significance, could also be considered.
- * A Compilation of photos from various squadrons -- this could be a montage of various squadrons or one specifically.

What else are we looking for?

Well, from both current Air Cadets and people who at one time were an Air Cadet, photos and “shout outs”, as well any short video vignettes between 30 seconds to no more than 60 seconds in length. In the vignettes, the person will talk about why the Cadet program was important to them and in what way it changed their lives.

(Note: By the way, in addition to any photos / videos that are sent in, League members are asked to also ensure that any individuals featured in them have given their permission for those photos and videos to be used. With that **statement or media / photo release** in hand, we'll be able to use such imagery. Please check out the Communications Tools on the ACL website at <https://aircadetleague.com/public-relations/> , which contains various helpful guidance about imagery taken of Cadets; this applies to other individuals as well, such as League Volunteers.)

Beyond helping us to publicly communicate about the League's achievement of 85 years of service to Canada and Canadian youth, all these various assets will also be compiled into a video to be shown at the President's Banquet during the League Leadership weekend this coming June. With that particular video in mind, please provide your various contributions by April 22nd, 2026. Please note that you can also submit any articles, comments/testimonials, photos, videos, etc. throughout the 85th anniversary year ahead.

As well, that video will also be used as part of a marketing/fundraising campaign to appeal to larger donors to support and enhance the League's current and future activities.

There are other products and activities that we're looking at associated with the anniversary, meanwhile, which we'll look to share in the year ahead.

The 85th anniversary of the Air Cadet League is an incredible story, and to make it successful we'll need all your help to bring those various assets together. We hope that you'll embrace this project and share those reflections of 85 years of the Air Cadet League with us!



Rotary club of Happy Valley-Goose Bay Becomes New Sponsor of 764 Squadron



The squadron benefits from its location in a region with a strong aviation presence and continues to play an important role in youth development in Labrador.

Dennis Dillon, Chair of the Newfoundland and Labrador Provincial Committee of the Air Cadet League of Canada, recently visited Happy Valley-Goose Bay to welcome a new sponsor of **764 Royal Canadian Air Cadet Squadron**. During his visit, the Rotary Club of Happy Valley-Goose Bay was formally announced as the squadron's sponsor at the Club's regular weekly Rotary meeting.

Mr. Dillon spoke to Rotary members about the role of the Air Cadet League and the importance of community sponsorship of the squadron. Under the leadership of Randy Letto, President of the Rotary Club of Happy Valley-Goose Bay, the Club brings a strong record of community service and youth support that aligns well with the aims of the Air Cadet movement.

Sponsorship is a key component of squadron operations. While the Canadian Armed Forces delivers training and oversees the cadet program, the sponsoring organization—through the Squadron Sponsoring Committee—provides financial oversight, fundraising, community liaison, and additional support that ensures squadrons remain viable and well resourced.

764 Squadron serves youth from Happy Valley-Goose Bay and surrounding communities, delivering the full Air Cadet program, including leadership development, citizenship training, aviation studies, physical fitness, and community service.

Following the Rotary meeting, Mr. Dillon attended the squadron's **monthly Commanding Officer's Parade**. After the parade, he met with parents interested in becoming involved with the **764 Squadron Sponsoring Committee**. Discussions focused on the role of the committee as the civilian support body for the squadron, working in partnership with the Commanding Officer and staff. Sponsoring Committee members are responsible for financial stewardship, fundraising, supporting logistics and administration, and strengthening community engagement. Active parent involvement is essential to maintaining a strong and effective squadron.

Rotary clubs have a long history of sponsoring Air Cadet squadrons across Canada, dating back to the earliest years of the movement. The Rotary Club of Happy Valley-Goose Bay's decision to assume sponsorship of 764 Squadron continues this tradition and provides a strong foundation for the squadron's future.

WHAT MAKES A VOLUNTEER STAY FOR 30 YEARS?

Terri Hinton, like many cadet parents, was bugged by her eldest son to join his friends in the local Cadet Squadron in Richmond, BC. Not only did her son join his friends, but she also realised she knew a number of the parents from school and the local community. They discovered she had a Costco card and asked her to buy the stock for canteen, a job she was willing to do despite working full time and being involved in Scouting as well as being a mother of three. By the time her second of three children joined, she signed up for the Squadron Sponsor Committee (SSC) and began helping with the tasks familiar to all of us connected to the Cadet Program; fund raising, recruiting more volunteers and organizing the mess dinner for the squadron. She dressed in a white shirt and black pants to help serve at the dinner and had a great time. Afterwards her daughter was going to a party and when she changed out of uniform, realised she had not brought shoes. "Our feet were the same size, so I swapped my shoes for hers;" laughs Terri. "I went home in her big cadet boots!"

You may know Terri from her work with the effective speaking program in which she became involved when her SSC chair, herself involved, asked for Terri's help. It was not long before she was running the program for BCPC and traveled to Yellowknife for the national competition. She took on the post at a national level and also became responsible for public affairs in BCPC. "I just did whatever need to be done." She explains, humbly. "Before Covid we had so much more access. We were at the Canada Day celebrations at Canada Place, conferences for teachers and the Legion, municipalities and more. It is much harder now."

She is now a National Governor and still does whatever needs doing. So why does Terri stay after her children have long since aged out and gone on to be amazing adults? "I found a community and friends, and I liked working with them." She also points out that it is great for adult growth, learning things like conflict resolution, time planning and encouraging others. It was nothing like her stressful job working at BC Children's Hospital.



"I also love to see the growth in the kids. The twelve year old who come in and hardly says anything, then suddenly you see them at the mall and they call out 'Hi ma'am', stand tall and open doors for me." The same youths that she runs into from time to time, now adults with families of their own, and confess they still can't call her Terri.

She has some very special memories of her volunteering time. She remembers two cadets from different squadrons in Victoria. They were very supportive of each other and had a photo taken with the two of them flanking Terri. "They were so small at that time but suddenly they were towering over me!" One of them became a lawyer and the other became a writer.

Another great moment was when she was recognised with the Governor General's Medal for Volunteers. She was given the option of having it presented by a member of the Royal Family on the next visit, but she decided it was more important to receive it amongst her peers and received it at a National Meeting.

After thirty years Terri Hinton has no plans to quit just yet and the Air Cadet League of Canada is lucky to have her working to do her best for the program. She is a role model to all of us, though she would probably deny that.

When asked what she would say to a potential volunteer she answered enthusiastically: "Do it!! As much as you are giving to your community, your community is giving back to you. **You get as much or more out of it, as you put in.** Besides, it feels good to help; just start small."
